Inclusive teaching methods



Inclusive teaching methodologies are educational approaches designed to enable every student to learn and actively participate in the classroom, regardless of their abilities or possible difficulties.



The main ones are:

• Division of time into stages

Division of a larger task or learning activity into smaller, more manageable steps, each with its own deadline.

• Group or pair work

Students collaborate in small groups or pairs to reach a shared learning goal.

• Cooperative learning

This is a structured group activity based on collaboration, positive interdependence and individual responsibility within a group of students.

• Tutoring

A student receives support and assistance in a specific study area from a peer or adult.

• Learning by discovery

It's a method that puts the student at the heart of learning, fostering their ability to explore, ask questions, form hypotheses, and reach conclusions, either on their own or with support.

• Use of teaching aids

Learning is supported through the use of concrete materials and tools, such as real objects, models, images, charts, concept maps, diagrams, educational software and more.

• Use of technologies

Use of digital tools and online resources in the teaching and learning process to personalise and make it accessible. This may include educational softwares, apps, online platforms, multimedia resources, virtual and augmented reality.

In conclusion, inclusive education celebrates each student's uniqueness, tailoring teaching and resources to individual needs to overcome difficulties and develop potential.
